How Travelling Light makes a difference

our Theory of Change

Travelling Light is working towards a world where every child's imagination is inspired by theatre.

This means that children and young people...

Experience and share joy with others.

Live in neighbourhoods that are vibrant and creative places.

creativity

To achieve this we create theatre with and for children and young people...

In our local community, from our studio in Barton Hill, Bristol. In schools and early years settings, supporting the cultural entitlement of hundreds of pupils per year. That 'travels light' to where children are, reaching children, young people and families who would not otherwise have the opportunity to experience theatre.



When The Birds Sang

A co-production with Theatre Hullabaloo

781 children in Bristol watched When The Birds Sang, a new dance-theatre show for ages 4+, which we toured to schools in Bristol.

I have never seen anything like that before. That was amazing.

Travelling Light's productions are unique.

It is so good that they perform in schools otherwise our children would not see theatre.

Inspired by children's own experiences, it combined contemporary dance and storytelling to celebrate the power of the imagination.

Independent evaluation showed that most children would not have experienced theatre if When The Birds Sang had not visited their school, and that the show enabled them to explore complex emotions through storytelling that did not talk down to children.





1,203 children and their carers enjoyed Igloo – our show for the very youngest theatre goers (0-3 year olds) – which we toured to children's centres and community settings in Bristol and around the South-West.

So wonderful, simple and inclusive.

Audience feedback

We reached many children and their carers who would not otherwise experience theatre, both through targeted community performances and engaging with early years settings and children's centres.

Working with Travelling Light has certainly enhanced their language development. In the sessions and following the performance, the open-ended nature of the work gave the children the chance to speak up...there was lots of play and many different narratives were going on.

Each show included a facilitated play session following the performance and audience members were given an Igloo picture book and a free activity sheet to enable families to continue with creative play at home.

Independent evaluation told us that *Igloo* supported children's speech and language. Children who watched *Igloo* were more able to articulate their feelings and emotions, and the accompanying play session and resources supported creative play in families' homes and in early years settings.



Creative Learning

Light Up School Learning



Light Up School Learning, our two-year project funded by Paul Hamlyn Foundation's Teacher Development Fund finished in July 2023, having reached over 1700 children and 35 teachers over two years.

The project involved artists working alongside teachers from five primary schools across Bristol, supporting them to use drama activities to improve pupils' learning across the curriculum.

Independent evaluation showed that Light Up School Learning had a significant impact on teachers and pupils, supporting pupils' speech and language, confidence, wellbeing, and engagement with learning. It enabled teachers to embed drama into their curriculum teaching.



Play In A Week and Arts Days

94 pupils took part in our Play In A Week projects at Bristol's Victoria Park Primary School and Dolphin School.

There are some children who I rarely hear speak who come to life when Play In A Week is on.

Play In A Week celebrates the creative ideas and imaginations of children; valuing them as artists in their own right. A whole year group spend a week working with our artists to produce a play, developing their skills as actors, musicians, dancers and designers.

As part of our Creative Learning programme, a further 362 children took part in 32 creative workshops and Arts Days in schools during the year.

Youth Theatre

For young people aged 7-19



Our Youth Theatre groups enjoyed exploring their creativity, having fun and learning new skills in drama and storytelling, with weekly sessions in term time.

Youth Theatre members told us that they:

- Valued creativity, freedom and having fun within the groups.
- Experienced increased confidence, making them feel braver and able to express themselves.
- Have made friends through the groups.
- Felt welcomed and supported by facilitators, and the groups were an inclusive space where they could be themselves and feel part of a community.

We provide free and discounted places to make sure finance is not a barrier to young people attending, and this year 45% of our Youth Theatre received bursaries and free places.

Louder Than Words

Shortlisted for a national award



Louder Than Words, our youth theatre group for Disabled children and young people aged 7+, celebrated its 10th anniversary in 2023 and was shortlisted for the Fantastic For Families Audience Impact & Innovation Award, alongside 5 other organisations nationally.

The Audience Impact and Innovation Award recognises the achievements of creative organisations and their innovation and adaptability to reach and make a difference to families in need.

Our evaluation told us that participants valued feeling included and accepted in the group, and that it developed their wellbeing, self-esteem and friendships. Parents told us it is a unique service in Bristol and if it was not there their child would not be able to attend any other group.

Summer School for Disabled Young People



11 young people took part in a summer school for Disabled young people, which we ran in partnership with WECIL – West of England Centre for Inclusive Living.

Whenever I have worked with Travelling Light, it's a joy. The children always leave smiling. They don't get bored. There is a difference I see in them when they are at Travelling Light. Travelling Light understand young people.

Over the course of four days (one per week), young people created their own story; which celebrated the resilience, strength, imagination and creativity that is within all of us. The summer school ended with a performance for family and friends in our studio.

Evaluation showed that the project met a clear need for Disabled young people in the holidays.

Creative holiday workshops

In the school holidays **62 children** took part in **17 free creative holiday workshops with free healthy meals** through our partnership with food charity St Luke's Lunch.

If St Luke's and Travelling Light weren't running this holiday club, he wouldn't have space to run and play. He gets to be a child, he has freedom to be himself.

The partnership combines each charity's specialisms to provide free creative holiday activities in Barton Hill alongside healthy meals, tackling food poverty and lack of affordable activities locally in the school holidays. Activities included storytelling, craft making and drama games.

Evaluation with families showed activities supported children's confidence and creativity and brought families in the community together. It also provided a welcoming and accessible introduction to theatre with 7 participants going on to join our Youth Theatre.



In 2023-24 we were proud that:

1,984

children and their carers watched our shows When The Birds Sang and Igloo, including **1,343** who took part in workshops and play sessions linked to the shows.

children in our local area of Barton Hill took part in 17 free creative holiday workshops with free healthy meals, and 113 local community members took part in our creative workshops as part of community events.

We provided employment for freelance artists and facilitators, and approximately days of paid work.

children and young people enjoyed creating theatre outside school as part of our Youth

Theatre and Louder Than Words groups and our summer school for young Disabled people.

pupils, 60 students and 20 teachers and early years practitioners benefitted from our Creative Learning programme in early years settings, schools, higher and further education.

We achieved target Baseline for Theatre Green Book on our Igloo tour with 86% of our sets, costumes and tech materials coming from a reused or recycled source.

In 2024-25 we will deliver:

Winter Lights

A community event in January 2025 with performances by young people based on the theme 'moments of joy': bringing together stories from young people and our communities, along with a lantern parade, workshops and installations.

Little Lights

A pilot project continuing our exploration of child-led creative play in early years, following on from *Igloo* and deepening our relationships with early years settings.

Light Up Language

A three-year project, working in depth with schools and early years settings using drama to support pupil oracy (speaking and listening).

Youth and Community programme

Continuing our regular engagement with local children, young people and families and providing safe creative spaces outside school from our studio in Barton Hill.

Creative Learning programme

Continuing our engagement with schools and education settings; and exploring new artistic ideas through research and development, including deepening our approach to working with children and young people in the development of our work.


The way I shaped my work has been fundamentally changed because of Travelling Light – they have mentored me. I have challenged myself to do things in a different way.


